

# Pre & Post Care for Hylenex & DePuffing Treatment

#### **Before Treatment:**

- ❖ Bring photos of the area of concern on a "good day" and "bad day"
- If you have open lesions, active cold sores, facial dermatitis or facial irruption you must wait until everything is healed

### **Considerations/Contraindications**

Caution using hylenex if you have an allergy to insects/bee stings! Inform your provider and consider a test spot.

#### Post-Procedure

- Some mild redness and swelling is normal for the first few days. Occasionally, the skin may look slightly dry post treatment. This normalizes in days-weeks.
- ❖ Patients should avoid strenuous exercise for 72 hours.
- ❖ We recommend waiting 2 weeks after dissolving to re-inject, if appropriate.
- ❖ The effect of the Hylenex/dissolving will begin to show between 1–36 hours from the time of treatment.

### Hylenex

Injected dissolver only

- ❖ Advise the provider if you have an allergy or hypersensitivity to bee stings, this is a contraindication.
- Some areas such as lips will swell more before the dissolving agent breaks down the product.
- The dissolving agent will sting slightly during injection, but reduces unwanted filler very quickly.
- Massage the area the day of injection to work it in to the area unless advised otherwise
- \* Keep the skin very hydrated with a gentle moisturizer and constant use of SPF post treatment.

## **DePuffing Treatment**

Dissolver plus RF Microneedling and lymphatic massage

- Advise the provider if you have any electrical device implanted in the body, this is a contraindication.
- ❖ The treatment will have 3 parts, ending with the RF microneedling
- Use gentle skincare, moisturizer and SPF post treatment. Redness and swelling is normal. It may look worse before looking better.
- Do not pick any small scabs that may occur from the RF microneedling. These are temporary and will exfoliate naturally.
